- Health and Wellbeing: Investigate the benefits of intergenerational interaction on physical health and Psychosocial domains across the life course.
- Education and Learning: Examine innovative educational practices that bridge generational divides and foster mutual learning.

Stories from the Field, for example but not limited to:

- Community Initiatives: Share real-world examples of successful intergenerational projects, including challenges faced and lessons learned.
- Personal Narratives: Submit personal stories that highlight the impact of meaningful intergenerational interactions on individuals and communities.
- Case Studies: Provide in-depth analyses of specific intergenerational programs, focusing on outcomes, best practices, and future directions.

Submission Guidelines:

- Research Papers (15 min plus 5 minutes Q&A): Abstracts should be 300–500 words. Submissions should include a clear statement of aims/objectives, methods, findings, and implications for practice and/or policy.
- Stories from the Field (15 minutes): Summaries should be 200–400 words, describing the initiative, key outcomes, and insights gained.
- Posters: Introducing your research, program, initiative or case study. These will be exhibited during the conference.
- Panel discussion: propose a topic! Make suggestions for a contemporary discussion and who should be involved as panel members.
